- Receipt of the Chapter 68 E-News and The Channel (WACVA-AWU National news publication).

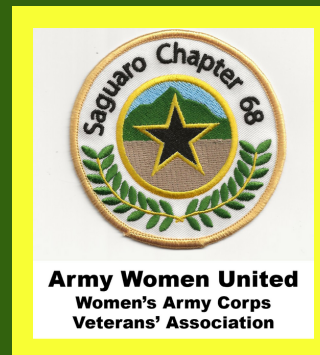
Membership Activities:
